¹ Advisors can discuss alternative longer time to completion options. **7 year Rule:** No more than 7 years may elapse between the start of the term of the earliest dated course on the [Advancement to Candidacy \(ATC\)](#) form and the date the last course is completed. ²Students should consult with the [Financial Aid Office](#) regarding the minimum number of registered units per semester to qualify for a financial aid package. A summer semester financial aid request requires a separate application process from that of the fall/spring academic year. ³Students choose in which semester they wish to take the elective course. The elective course can be any professionally relevant *advisor-approved* 3 unit graduate or upper-division undergraduate level course, numbered 300 or higher, from any department, or taken at another university through a [special enrollment program](#). ⁴ In order to enroll in the PH 890 MPH Culminating Experience Seminar course, a student must have a 3.0 or higher cumulative GPA, and have completed or be enrolled concurrently to complete all other required coursework of the 44-unit MPH degree.
