

INTERNSHIP ANNOUNCEMENT

POSITION: San Mateo County Health Tobacco Prevention Program is seeking a health education intern to assist with tobacco-free and smokefree policy education activities implemented countywide. This individual will work collaboratively with the Tobacco Prevention Program staff and the Tobacco Education Coalition members.

LOCATION: Work from home with in-person 1-2 days per month in San Mateo County

DURATION: 6 months, start date May 1, 2024

HOURS: Up to 10 hours per week, with a minimum of 3 days per week.

PAYMENT: \$19.94 per hour and up to \$4,500

DESCRIPTION OF ACTIVITIES:

- 1. Research and review state and local tobacco cessation services available within San Mateo County to create and update educational resources and materials.
- 2. Provide education to residents on local tobacco-free and smokefree policy education, adoption, implementation, and sustainability.
- 3. Create and maintain a comprehensive six-month calendar of educational messages, videos, and interactive activities to be promoted that are both culturally- and linguistically tailored to target communities.
- 4. Identify methods and make recommendations to improve the quality of existing tobacco-free and smokefree communications to increase engagement.
- 5. Attend and participate in quarterly coalition meetings.
- 6. Other policy education activities as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- 1. Current student in a community college or undergraduate program
- 2. Knowledge of public health, public policy, and health equity
- 3. Knowledge of tobacco access and consumption among youth
- 4. Attention to detail, accuracy, and deadline driven
- 5. A team-player and ability to work independently
- 6. Possess good communication, relationship, and organizational skills
- 7. Candidates with lived experience are strongly encouraged to apply
- 8. Bilingual skills preferrable
